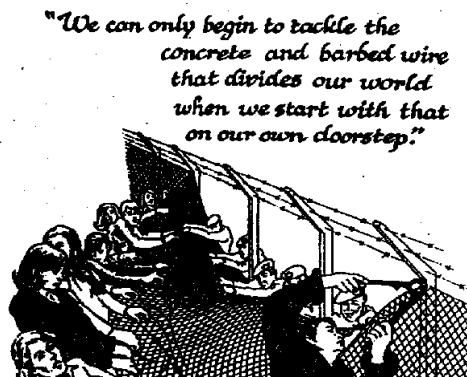


# Sex, Violence, & Culture
